As part of the ongoing development of JOL Online we will be adding a search facility onto the system for you to search a Lesson Identified (LI) and Notable Practice (NP) number.

LESSON IDENTIFIED

We have a duty to exercise with COMAH operators in response to their offsite plans as part of the LRF. Services should invite COMAH Operators to 1 day JESIP training along with other Cat 1 and 2 partners.

LESSON IDENTIFIED

In line with the Joint Doctrine Publication 02: UK operations: the defence contribution to resilience and security (third edition), JESIP is covered in this current publication. However it is important that services identify and invite all respective Military **Explosive Ordnance Disposal Commanders** to ongoing 1 day JESIP training.

Reminder for LRFs:

When reviewing emergency response plans and TCG locations ensure TCGs are fit for purpose so that organisations can work effectively to respond to incidents.

NOTABLE PRACTICE

Good to see partners across the rail industry (Rail Incident Officers (RIO)) are wearing tabards to ensure they are easily identifiable and contribute to a

Services must continue to promote and embed the use of M\ETHANE across commanders at all levels and control rooms. This provides a consistent and standardised approach to support shared situational awareness.

When working on or in hybrid vehicles it is critical to ensure that the vehicle is isolated prior to any extrication. Failure to isolate would mean the vehicle is still live. A near miss for the situation has been filed by the Police vehicle examiner.

LESSON IDENTIFIED

Evidence clearly suggests that where incidents are occurring across the UK and Commanders are mobilised to respective TCGs / SCGs, the knowledge gap of the application of ResilienceDirect is inconsistent. Services should ensure all commanders and their teams who are likely to respond to TCG / SCGs are fully conversant with ResilienceDirect.
